Scientist Irene Joliot Curie, who with her husband, won the Nobel Prize for chemistry in 1935, remained in Paris throughout the German occupation. For 4 years the laboratroy manufactured explosives for the French Underground under the very noses of ~~the~~ German physicists who occupied the floor above.

It required tremendoud courage to engage in work that meant summary execution or torture in a concentration camp upon discovery.

Irene Joliot Curie surely drew inspiration from her mother, who had often related to her daughters, how she had fought for Polish independence during her school days in Poland, and who had thought nothing of driving an ambulance under fire in the terrible days of World War one.

And now in memory of that remarkable woman whom the whole world claims and respects and cherishes, Madame Maria Sklodowska-Curie, we play a polka WANDA I STAS - VANDA & STASH.
