INTERVIEW WITH A POLISH FLIER

Polish captain-pilot Thomas Jaronski, bombed Germany 42 times. He was over Hamburg, Kiel, Bremen, Cologne, Essen, Duesseldorf, Dortmund, Emden, Lubeck, Rostock, and many other German industrial centers.
