Village Is Massacred By Nazi Troops in Italy

ROME, Oct. 3—Rome received today a report of more German atrocities that followed the killing of nine Germans near Rosi in Tuscany by Partisans. Nazis rushed to Rosi, but all the villagers had fled so they butchered the residents of Santa Anna.

It was Sunday and most of the inhabitants were attending mass. A few German soldiers entered the church and ordered all out. The villagers were killed by machine guns on the church steps.

Then the Nazis went from house to house, dragged men, women and children into the street and massacred them. The bodies were piled in the village square and burned with flame-throwers.

Of the population of 600 only twenty-seven escaped, with the help of a German soldier, who was horrified by the massacre.

In a village near Luoca thirteen citizens were killed in the square. One was getting a shave at the barber's when he was taken and he was executed with a towel around his neck and his face still white with soap.

In Massrota the entire family of Count Minutoli was massacred.
